1 Overall quality at a glance

The following experimental techniques were used to determine the structure:

SOLUTION NMR

The overall completeness of chemical shifts assignment is 36%.

There are no overall percentile quality scores available for this entry.

2 Ensemble composition and analysis ⓘ

This entry contains 20 models. Model 11 is the overall representative, medoid model (most similar to other models). The authors have identified model 1 as representative, based on the following criterion: *closest to the average*.

The following residues are included in the computation of the global validation metrics.

Ill-defined regions of proteins are excluded from the global statistics.

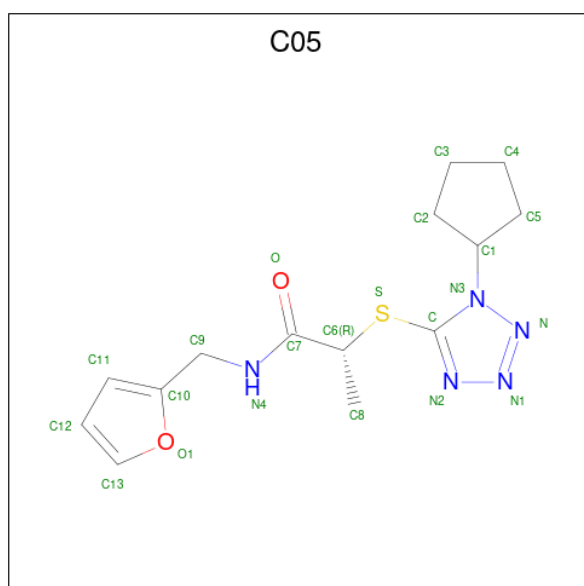
3 Entry composition [i](#)

There are 2 unique types of molecules in this entry. The entry contains 2314 atoms, of which 1140 are hydrogens and 0 are deuteriums.

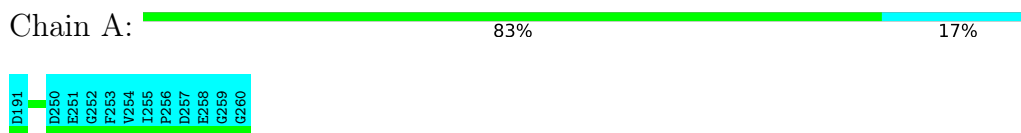

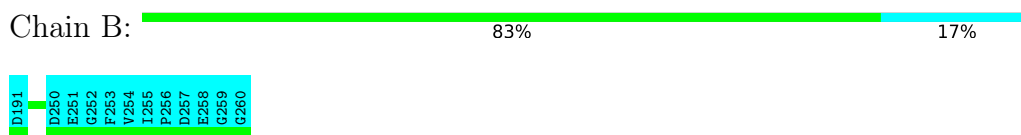
4.1 Average score per residue in the NMR ensemble

These plots are provided for all protein, RNA, DNA and oligosaccharide chains in the entry. The first graphic is the same as shown in the summary in section 1 of this report. The second graphic shows the sequence where residues are colour-coded according to the number of geometric quality criteria for which they contain at least one outlier: green = 0, yellow = 1, orange = 2 and red = 3 or more. Stretches of 2 or more consecutive residues without any outliers are shown as green connectors. Residues which are classified as ill-defined in the NMR ensemble, are shown in cyan with an underline colour-coded according to the previous scheme. Residues which were present in the experimental sample, but not modelled in the final structure are shown in grey.

- Molecule 1: Microtubule-associated protein RP/EB family member 1



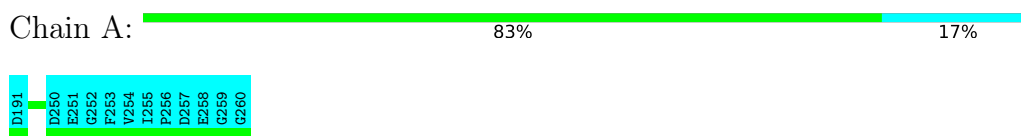

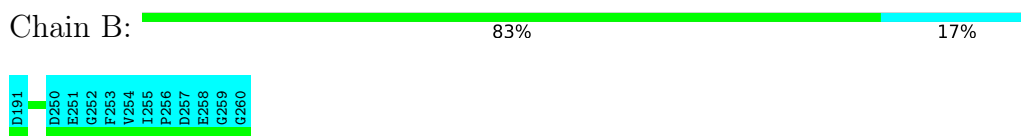
4.2 Residue scores for the representative (medoid) model from the NMR ensemble

7.1.3 Completeness of resonance assignments

The following table shows the completeness of the chemical shift assignments for the well-defined regions of the structure. The overall completeness is 36%, i.e. 601 atoms were assigned a chemical shift out of a possible 1676. 0 out of 26 assigned methyl groups (LEU and VAL) were assigned stereospecifically.

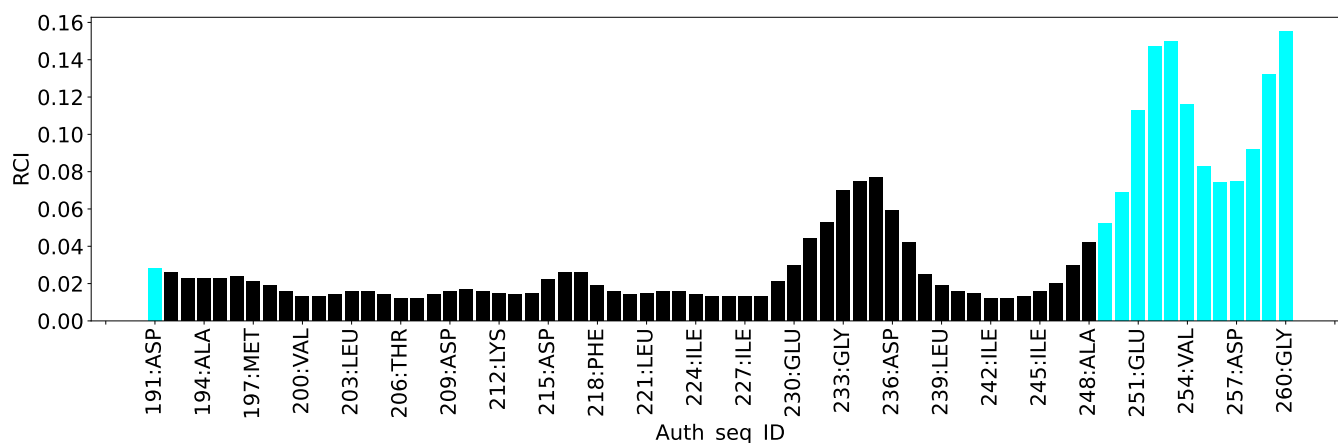
